"Now if we are able to pay down a significant portion of the mortgage on the Community Center, we will "set free" funds that are currently used for monthly mortgage payments. Funds that can be used for other ministry purposes and activities. It's exciting to think about the opportunities – and challenges – that God will place in our path as we seek to do what He is blessing and resourcing us to do."



HOW AND WHEN DO I MAKE A PLEDGE?

Here is the process we will follow for making our pledges:

- 1. Every member will receive an invitation to the Pledge Event which includes a pledge card for review and for your family to discuss its commitment toward making our \$500,000 goal.
- 2. There will be pledge cards at each place setting at the Pledge Event on November 10th. We will all make our pledges then.
- 3. Do not fill out your pledge until the end of pledge event. We want the fellowship and speakers at the event to move us.
- 4. If you cannot attend the pledge event, members will contact you to remind you to turn in a pledge.

Giving Cheerfully

In a book, a missionary pastor describes the day when "the fetters on the little constricted box in my heart broke." While walking the market place in an old Kisumu market in Africa, this missionary notes that his "natural inclination (and that of everyone I've ever known) is to negotiate, to walk away, to offer half, no matter what the asking price." It is man's (and woman's) natural inclination to only offer half. "Offering half" simply is another way of saying, "offering less." We always want to offer less and to keep more. That's because of the "fetters on the little constricted box" in our heart.

To bring us all to the point of "offering more" many would use God's Word of Law. The Law with its "you shall", "you should", "you ought" phrases can guilt many a person into giving more. But that kind of giving is without joy. It's not cheerful. The Lord wants us to give "cheerfully." Cheerful givers give because they want to give. Givers who want to give, give more, and give more often.

The Law can't make us into "cheerful givers." It only makes us "guilty givers." Cheerful giving is the fruit of the Gospel of God. Cheerful giving comes from the faith and knowledge that God is good, that He's provided (providing) all that we need to support this body and life, and that from His bounty we can give back to Him and to our neighbors. When faith is clinging to God's bounty in Christ, there is no worry about money. Instead, there is joy. With joyful hearts, rooted in the Gospel of Christ and Him crucified, God's people can return to Him a tithe, a special offering, a gift, not out of guilt but joy.

This missionary, fetters broken and his heart opened by the gospel, shopped the marketplace. And rather than "offering half" turned the tables and stunned a local shop owner. Eyeing a beautifully carved stone box he asked the man, "how much." "Three dollars," was the reply. "No, can't do it," retorted the missionary. Back and forth went the two, until finally the missionary said, "I'll give you five dollars!" He offered and gave more than half, more than cost, more than he needed to. He joyfully gave because he had been set free from guilt and was free in Christ.

Indeed, God is merciful to those who repent. Cheerful givers delight His heart because cheerful giving flows from faith in the forgiveness of sins. It is the sign of the heart renewed in Christ, the source of all joy, even the joy of giving.



FAQ'S FOR THE CAMPAIGN

Q. What is the purpose of the *Building God's Family* campaign?

A. The complete case statement for the campaign is on the front page of this newsletter, but in short, we want to pay off as much debt as possible so we are having a capital campaign to inform, inspire and move our members to make over-and-above gifts to pay down our debt.

Q. What will paying down the debt do for us?

A. A rough calculation is that every dollar of principal paid down results in ten cents of interest saved. So if we raise \$100,000 we will have an extra \$10,000 a year for more new ministry.

Q. What is our goal?

A. Our goal is to raise \$500,000. This will take some work on our part but it will provide us around \$50,000 a year for added ministry. We can do a lot of good things for the Gospel with that sort of funding.

Q. How long does the Capital Campaign last?

A. The *Building the Family of God* campaign will be very active for about three months. During that time we will

be learning how to become stronger spiritually and how to use biblical stewardship principles in all of our giving. We want all of our members to be able to make God-pleasing pledges that are based on both His Law and His Gospel.

Q. When will I be asked to make a pledge?

A. We are having a wonderful Pledge Dinner after church on Sunday, November 10. There will be an opportunity at this dinner for all members to bring their pledge cards forward. You may also mail in your pledge card or bring it in to the church office at any time.

Q. When should I start contributing toward my pledge?

A. This is a three year pledge campaign, with contributions scheduled to begin in January, 2020. Each year you will receive special monthly envelopes to make your contributions. Of course, you may start to make your contributions at any time, and make them as you are able throughout the three year period.
